The Proposed & Opposed Farm scale Trials

Unbelievable as it may seem, the Government has actually decided to go ahead with the scaling up of their irrelevant, poorly designed and polluting farm-scale trials, to a possible eighty this summer. The only way we are going to stop them is full-scale local campaigns. This is an amazing opportunity to radicalize and empower people all over Britain and give us a taste of real democracy in action. So get planning. Whether it's tractor diving, tunnelling (but watch out for that horizontal gene transfer in the soil bacteria!) or lobbying your local councillors, get those community campaigns going and have a good one!

Here's some inspiration from the campaigns run against the three winter oilseed rape farm-scale trials. The **Hemel Hempstead GM Action Group** have been extremely active eliciting local support in Hemel Hempstead and Berkhamsted against the farm-scale trials on their doorstep, taking a huge petition to the farmer growing the crop at Piccots End.

The campaign was to culminate in a rally at the site on Sunday 9th April, however there is now hardly any crop to see BECAUSE IT FAILED TO COME UP. This was possibly due to some troublesome WOOD PIGEONS he! he! Instead there will be a gathering to celebrate and scheme for the summer. **Get to Gaddesden Row near the field at 1pm on**

the 9th of April for the "Crop's A Flop Party". Bring an organic picnic - there will be costumes, music, poetry, performance and speakers. The farmer is likely to grow further GM crops soon and its the perfect opportunity to put our heads together and sort out strategy for the trials nationwide. Shuttles will be arranged from Hemel station and coaches will run from London and Oxford, ring GEN for more details. 7000 signatures have already been handed in to sympathetic Labour MP, Tony McWalter, in protest at the new planting.

The Lincolnshire GE group persuaded the District Council of West Lindsay, which had the other two winter oilseed rape trials in the area, to pass a motion that included the following sentence "Our district is becoming the focal point for these experiments, without local consultation or debate, even though the potential repercussions are not fully understood. It is essential to ensure that we consolidate maximum protection of our wildlife and the wider environment and maintain the integrity of non-GM crops". They have stated that they do not want trials in their district. West Lindsay also has two proposed maize trials.

Lincolnshire has five of the farm-scale trials announced so far. The Lincolnshire GE group has already worked with local people to stop a GM sugar beet site from being planted in Friskney Tofts. The site was right next to a salt marsh that has several special designations as a nature reserve of international importance. There were also organic allotments less than a mile away.

The GM farmer pulled out less than a week after the announcement, mainly due to pressure from local farmers and businesses and also because public feeling was running very high. The local agricultural suppliers said they would refuse to lend the farmer their farm machinery for fear of crosscontamination. The planned public meeting went ahead anyway with Lincolnshire farmers up in arms at the lack of local consultation and the general crisis in British farming. Two other farmers have since pulled out due to intense local pressure.

How many farmers will have to pull out before the Government will call a halt to this farce? Why not ask them! There will be public 'information' meetings at locations around the country. 4th April- Lincoln; 6th April- Worcester; 11th April- Norwich and 13th April- Ipswich. There will be a break until after Easter when there will be meetings in York, Luton, Leicester, Hull, Cambridge, Taunton, Crewe and Basingstoke. State still refuses to give GE a fair trial

Smashing Stuff On 31st July 1999 a mass action, "Smash Genetix" took place at Home Farm, Lincolnshire, to decontaminate a farm-scale trial of GM maize (see GenetiX Update Autumn 99). People attended from all over the country, it was well organised, and since described as "a very sexy action". Unfortunately 46 people were arrested and charged with "conspiracy to commit criminal damage". Half later had their charges dropped. All arrested were detained for over 40 hours and were granted severe bail conditions. Three people were remanded for a week.

Over the next six months the remaining 23 defendants had their charges lessened to "aggravated trespass" and "criminal damage". Building up to what was going to be a lengthy trial by a specially selected magistrate (trial by jury was denied), and allegations from the farmer that the maize targeted was non-GM, the defendants, split between six solicitors and different defences, faced a very messy case.

On the first day of the trial it became apparent that the state was reluctant to press ahead, and a plea bargain was offered. In the end, it was agreed that those without previous convictions would accept a bind over to "keep the peace", and the other defendants who accepted "disorderly behaviour" were sentenced with conditional discharges, fines up to £200 and costs of £45.

The CPS must be thanked for the good times had and new friends made. The networking will definitely be useful to GM campaigners in this year's summer of action. Lesson from Smash Genetix - if you do a lab test, take samples from 4 corners of the supposed GM field.

The Trolley Two Noah Tucker and Simon Hindmarsh were charged with theft and handling stolen goods respectively after taking 96 items of food from Sainsbury's Camden Town branch, London, last February without paying and put them on display as a bio-hazard waste dump. After submitting their defence, and pleading not guilty, the Crown notified the judge and defence that they did not propose to offer any evidence. They were found not guilty and awarded costs.

Two men were questioned, released and have now been charged with the charge of 'aggravated trespass' after pulling up a field of GM oil seed rape last November. The Northern Self-Appointed Guardians of the Environment targeted the field outside the village of Hutton Magna, near Darlington, County Durham. The group claimed the field was being used for GM trials. A spokesman said:

"We are a group of friends who have never got involved in a GM protest before. I hope that our action will inspire others to do the same". THE SUMMER FARM SCALE TRIALS AND GRID REFERENCES SO FAR. CHECK THE MEDIA AND WITH FRIENDS OF THE EARTH FOR MORE AS THEY ARE ANNOUNCED.



PRACTICAL THINGS TO DO ABOUT THE FARM SCALE TRIALS

Get on to your local authority "Now, of course, if local authorities all over the country declared they didn't want it, then it probably would not be possible to go ahead." Let's see if Meacher will uphold the above comment he made on the Today programme last week. Until now no local authorities have been consulted by the Government on the location of farm-scale trials, even those that have endorsed the Five Year Freeze campaign. The Five Year Freeze has a list of 45 local authorities, town and district councils who have signed to them. The Women's Institute writing to every Parish Council in the country to persuade them to have a local referendum on whether GM crops should be grown in their area The following local councils have acted to try and stop their tenant farmers from growing GM crops -Cambridgeshire, Dorset, Gloucestershire, Norfolk, Somerset, Warwickshire, Oxfordshire and the Isle of Man. **Declare GM-Free Zones** GM-free zones are appearing worldwide: Switerland, Brazil, Italy and the Isle of Wight. There may well be a constitutional crisis as Wales also wants to be GM-free. The first one in the UK was launched in Norfolk at the new Greenpeace Campaign Centre. Pictures of 'GM-free zone' signs and the campaign logo are available from Greenpeace. **Set up a local group** Contact GEN for advice, support and a box of resources from a range of campaigning organisations. Farm-scale trial briefings are available from Friends of the Earth, Genewatch and Greenpeace.



Comment

Three years of campaigning and what do we have? Probably 80 farm-scale trials this year, Aventis maize about to be available for farmers to grow commercially in the UK; weekly pro-GM documentaries, an anti-terrorism bill threatening to proscribe environmentalist groups; cover-ups, fudges, spin and hypocrisy from that self-styled voice of 'neutrality' formerly known as Tony Blair, and an "adequate" Bio-safety Protocol.

OK this is all a bit depressing, but hold on, just look at what we have achieved. We have labelling legislation on food, we have possibly provoked a constitutional crisis in Wales, we have country pubs and fast-food joints proudly declaring themselves GM-free right down to their enzymes and derivatives, we have Jack 'boot' Cunningham hounded out of office, we have the average bod on the street able to tell you that GM will not save the planet, we have GM seed sales down 25% this year in the US, Canada and Argentina, and the biotech corporations changing their names faster than rats leaving the sinking island of Aventis!

Vladimir Lay, from Croatia's Green Action has been quoted as saying that the 'genetiX snowball' handbook he downloaded from the internet has become his campaigning 'bible'.

A note for jaded activists who think that everything is now safely in the hands of the more established environmental campaigns groups. Come on guys, here is a campaign that we can finally win and there is still an amazing opportunity to push a radical agenda that is not being pushed, as well as lots of fun to be had and new avenues of activism to explore! Get hold of your decontamination suits and your seedlings, there is no room for apathy. The next few months could well decide the fate of GE in this country. Happy gardening!

Pants to GM cotton!!

Our quest: to raise the profile of GM cotton, to wake people up to the problem with their knickers. Our target: Marks and Spencer's - Britain's most famous supplier of intimate apparels (thats technical speak for your undies). Our problem: We'd chosen the opening of a new flagship store in Manchester, on the site of the IRA Bombing (June 1996). This event signified Manchester's ability to overcome terrorism and keep on shopping - civic pride and celebration abounded. 3rd April Norwich Crown Court- Greenpeace in court As well as 60 plus farm scale trials, the state is sponsoring a major trial in Norwich Crown Court. 28 activists arrested on the Greenpeace decontamination of the Lyng farm-scale trial in Norfolk last July go on trial possibly for up to a month The 28, charged with theft and criminal damage, will be mounting a defence of lawful excuse. After an attempt by the prosecution to disqualify defence expert witnesses failed this March, it looks like this may be the first case where GE itself may be placed on trial. An acquital based on this defence has profound implications for future actions undertaken to protect our countryside, agriculture and health from open-air genetic pollution.

Newcastle animal feed action

BOCM Pauls, a company that manufactures more animal feed than any other company in the UK, and uses GM ingredients in most of its products, was the target for Newcastle-based genetics group GeneNo! The company's cattle feed mill at Chilton Industrial Estate, County Durham, was visited last December by three cows who scaled two large grain silos and suspended a banner with the words "NO GM Animal Feeds". The rest of the herd remained on the ground holding banners reading "We don't need - GM animal feed!" Having made their point, the herd soon decided it was time to leave, but found themselves unable to get out of the gates which had been padlocked. The police arrived and there was some confusion when the cows claimed to have shut the factory down. However the gates were quickly unlocked by security guards and the animals have returned to their organic pastures green.



Greenpeace Stops Ship Gm Soya ship

Greenpeace have been up to their old tricks again!! At 7.40am on 24th February, Greenpeace intercepted the bulk carrier Iolcos Grace believed to be carrying up to sixty thousand tonnes of GM soya into Britain. The vessel was boarded by Greenpeace volunteers off the coast of Anglesey in North Wales with Greenpeace activists hanging off the anchor, preventing further movement. This action is part of a campaign to prevent GM crops from being imported into the UK. The GM soya will mostly be used for animal feed, which will end up in meat and dairy products for human consumption. The owners of the cargo, Cargill, operate the only GM soya mill in the UK, which is the largest source of GM contamination in the country. Turning this mill GM-free would affect the growing of GM soya worldwide.

The ship docked again conveniently after the OECD conference, but Greenpeace folk were

arrested before they got anywhere near the docks.

Oxford Supermarket Action

Anti-GM protesters donning Tony Blair masks offering genetically modified cooked breakfasts to Tesco's mid-morning customers to highlight the issue of GM-animal feed. Other protesters, dressed as cows, chickens and pigs lined the front entrance of Tesco, offering information on GM animal feed and urging shoppers to ask, "Where's our choice Mr Tesco?" Letters signed by the general public were presented to the store manager, Mr Tilsley, who promised to arrange a proper reply to each letter. There were no takers for the Blair GM breakfast.

Dolly creator meets sticky-end!

Monday, 24th January 2000 Keith Campbell, creator of Dolly the cloned sheep, leading biotechnician and co-author of the modestly titled book 'The Second Creation' became the latest to be targeted by a cell of the Biotic Baking Brigade (BBB). Campbell was attempting to promote himself, his technologies and his new publication with an illustrated talk at the University of Sussex. We, the Sussex cell of the BBB said, "Keith Campbell: Fuck Your Sheep!" As 'Special Agent Apple' of the BBB declared, from somewhere in the mountains of North Western California, "The technocrats who dominate industrial society may call us radical and unrealistic, but the dream of a bio-diverse future is one for which we will fight until the day we pie."

UK Agriculture Minister eclaired

Controversy has surrounded Nick Brown's eclairing at the NFU AGM, as the elairer's life in Hollywood became the subject of press interest. Basically, an éclair is an éclair is an éclair and should be recognised as such in the annals of pie-rect action. The whole conference sounds as though it was a government propaganda mission to allieviate the crisis in British farming by persuading them to go GM, and try selling their products on the internet.

OECD Conference on GM food safety in Edinburgh, 28th February.

A giant chimera and a banquet of Fat Cats met the delegates arriving at this international gathering of 'experts' to discuss the 'safety of GM foods'. The chimera, a creature with a calf's head, sheep and pig's body and chicken and goat's legs highlighted the concerns of Compassion in World Farming about genetic experiments and the genetic engineering of farm animals, to become living factories for the Corporations. Cows have been genetically engineered to produce human milk protein which can be made into baby milk and sold to the babies in Africa. (The Mark Thomas Comedy Product exposed this as being ready for commercialisation in less than 30 months with deals already struck with baby milk powder producers). Goats have been engineered by pharmaceuticals companies to express a protein in their milk that plays a vital role in regulating blood clotting.

20 anti-GM activists wearing fat cat suits, ties and pig masks held a 'banquet' to represent corporate greed. Shackled at their feet, activists in white suits and wearing skeleton masks were chained to each other with map of third world countries. A large banner behind read STOP THE THIRD WORLD WAR".

Super busy Scarborough have persuaded local frozen food giants McCain to stop using GM potatoes as well as drawing a huge apple-shaped maze on the local beach to draw attention to the ma(i)ze that the biotech companies have greated to micloid people into

companies have created to mislead people into accepting GM food and farming. The apple represented the threat from GE to bio-diversity.

Its about where we begin and end... Notes from a human GE workshop.

What better way to spend a sunny morning in Glastonbury than discussing something other than ecological breakdown? Until now eugenics, and the applications and implications of human GE, have been the Cinderella of the GE campaign. This is probably because they open up the most fundamental philosophical territory many shy away from.

But not the brave Theo and Shannon, who guided us through a brief (!) synopsis of the situation so far and provided co-counselling on our responses to it. The counselling focused on our reservations about disability and how many of them stem from our own sense of shame and guilt, rather than what it's actually like to be different. We then skimmed through biowarfare, insurance ramifications, gene therapy, biopiracy and cloning before tackling the really chunky topics: * That society had taken death out of the life cycle and now views it as some kind of avoidable failure. * That the commodification of the body is capitalism's knight in shining lab coat offering whole new realms of exploitation through patents long after material resources have been consumed. *That again we must ask the most basic questions about who is pushing this technology forward. Why are Corporations investing millions into investigating cancer genes when the EU won't even grant £1million to research on suspect carcinogens being regularly pumped into the *What will environment? prevent a magnification of the class system to brave new world proportions? * Who will define suffering and desirabilty? Ultimately, as with agricultural GE, this is a reductionist science, a powerful tool in an irresponsible world, where the risks outweigh the benefits. Potentially it offers much but currently presents the solution to suffering as an end to 'sufferers'. As an issue it provides a remarkable opportunity to reveal the twisted values at the heart of the system, scrutinise our own prejudices and celebrate the glory of life and death. Start talking....

International Actions

From our activist in Seattle After

the success of the global protests during the G8 summit in 1998 and again on June 18th 1999, the call went out to shut down the World Trade Organisation meeting in Seattle on November 30th (N30). No one dreamed that it would be so successful! A 10-day convergence took place beforehand where activists from around the world met to share inspiration and ideas for N30. Many were inspired by the recent protests against GE in Britain. The atmosphere in the US is much like it was here a few years ago, with the stakes being raised, hostility towards biotech growing and the public becoming more aware of what's going on. With this in mind, GE was placed high on the Seattle agenda.

On N30, we marched on the Conference Centre, and affinity groups (groups of 5-15 people working together for a common purpose) blockaded the roads. The WTO was shut down! Only 200 of the 5000 delegates got in, and the opening ceremony was cancelled. The protests continued, with almost 600 arrests. People's strength and bravery was incredible. On December 3rd, the WTO meeting was abandoned with nothing agreed due to disruption both in and out of the Conference. Victory! We learned so much over those few days about effective consensus decisionmaking, about organising non-hierarchically, what pepper gas tastes like and much else. Seattle was one of the most significant points in my life, and indeed, in the life of this growing global community of resistance.

More on protest in the USA

Along with 21 decontaminations, there have been some hardcore actions (see press release below). Other recent actions include a strawberry decontamination and a shut down of Cargill's HQ in Minnesota. There were also amazing scenes at the Biodevastation Conference in Boston with over 3000 people marching on BIO2000, the industry conference, and challenging them to come out and debate.

As the US public slowly awakens from its 'consume more, trust the Government' trance, there have been placard-waving demos, especially outside the Food and Drug Adminstration (FDA) hearings [www.biointegrity.org], and tales of local campaigns springing up.

Earth Liberation Front target Michigan State

University "On the eve of the new millennium, the Earth Liberation Front struck back at one of the many threats to the natural world as we know it. On December 31, 1999 at approximately 9:00pm, the ELF entered the Agricultural Hall at Michigan State University in Lansing, Michigan. Our destination was room 324, the offices of Catherine Ives et al.

The project being conducted through this office is funded by Monsanto and USAID and was designed to not only pursue research concerning genetically engineered sweet potatoes, corn and other crop vegetables, but to lobby developing countries to abandon their current agricultural practices and to rely on genetically engineered plants and thus corporations like Monsanto. Local newspapers have put the damage done to the building at \$400,000, with documents and equipment totally destroyed. Cremate Monsanto! End G.E.!"

Protests in Australia on World

Consumer Rights Day (15 March), there were protests in most capital cities and regional centres with an information leaflet launched to mark World Consumer Rights Day and to counter government-funded disinformation. Crop pulling has also hit Oz as activists from the Free Seed Liberation Front (FSLF) upended and trampled more than 200 genetically engineered pineapples in a field trial near Brisbane (Queensland). We noticed this quote at the bottom of their press release. "DIRECT ACTION IS NOT ONLY JUSTIFIED, IT'S ALSO VERY EFFECTIVE". Hmm, nice to know the Update reaches a wide audience!!

Indian Farmers' Verdict on GM

A citizens jury of Indian farmers voted overwhelmingly against the introduction of GM crops. The jury of 14 farmers, ranging from a landless labourer to a prosperous cultivator of Monsanto's GM-seeds, cast nine votes to four against sowing GM seed on their land. The jury heard evidence from expert witnesses including Monsanto, top Indian scientists and Indian Government officials on the pros and cons of GM crops. The four-day trial was held under a tamarind tree in BG Kere village, Karnataka, India. See Splice for more info.

ASEED strategy session on GE: Consolidating 'No' in Europe!

Last November, 37 campaigners from all over Europe, the CIS, the US and Canada came together in an obscure, but beautiful city in Russia with the modest task of working out where next for the GE campaign in Europe. Representatives came from groups as diverse as the Finnish Seed-Savers association; Genetic Concern, Ireland; Green Library, Latvia; Genetic Snowball; Active Consumers Denmark; the Edmonds Institute, USA and the Russian group No Corporations!

The week was fascinating, wonderful and overwhelming. It was 'genetic engineering' over breakfast, lunch, dinner and vodka as people passionate about challenging the threats that GE poses to the planet came together under one roof to inspire and alarm each other with their experiences and predictions on the upcoming research agendas and corporate strategies.

From Ed on Biowarfare to Fernando from the Spanish group 'Ecologistas enaccion' talking about his campaign 'Under the Asphalt is the Garden' to bring guerrilla gardening to Spanish cities and to reinvigorate abandoned villages as ecovillages. From Vera who almost singlehandedly stopped GM trial sites in Hungary to Beth and Christina with the inside gossip on the Biosafety Protocol negotiations. We also heard about the situation in Eastern Europe and the CIS where, but for the vigilance of a few amazing people, the Corporations would be getting away unnoticed with courting the directors of bankrupt research institutions, illegally dumping cheap GE grains rejected by Western Europe and generally waging a war of contamination on these unsuspecting and unregulated countries through illegal field trials and commercial growing.

The experience truly broadened all our perspectives on the anti-GM campaign and why we must fight this battle globally whilst recognising the diverse political and cultural landscapes that we face in our own countries. This was the thinking behind the Global Week of Action (see article). We also recognised the similarities of our vision, which resulted in the 'Bryansk Declaration'.

We may have new issues to worry about and tough campaigns to run, but we know that we have a network of wonderful dedicated people around the world that share our common vision. Thanks to Ludmilla, Igor and all the folks at the environmental NGO, "Viola" who offered us kind hospitality in the true Russian style! The recent news that Russian PM, Blair's buddy Vladimir Putin has banned Greenpeace and other eco-groups, has disturbed all of us who know how hard the Russian NGO's are working to raise awareness of the dangers of GM technology.

Similarly in health and medicine, shouldn't we consider carefully whether we want to adopt a technology that favours the return of eugenics and genetic discrimination, and which inflicts endless suffering on transgenic animals, designed to produce medicines and organs for human health? Should we not instead investigate holistic approaches to health and medicine?

Viva Varieties! This global week of activities is not just against genetic engineering, but to celebrate the diversity of our local agricultural systems, of alternative approaches to health, and of our communities. It is also for our diversity as activists from our different cultural and social backgrounds. It will be an opportunity to strengthen the international network of anti-GE-activists and show the solidarity between groups that have diverse political and social backgrounds to their campaigning. Together we can challenge the corporate monoculture.

We intend the week of action to grow as our movement does: at the beginning of the week we will protest against industrial agriculture, Genetic Engineering and world trade systems. Towards the end of the week we will set up positive alternatives to this institutionalized madness. There will also be some global actions to participate in. Spread the word and set the agenda. Aberystwyth Action Against GMO's is currently putting the pressure on a local research station, the Institute of Grassland and Environmental Research (IGER) and we need your help!! He was very smiley and noncommittal. So, we've been drawing local public attention to what they are up to IGER, with newspaper articles, letters, a demo and banner drops. We're requesting a site visit along with other local environmental groups and guess what?! No joy. Prof. Pollock is definitely getting less smiley in his response to us and we would like to spread this localised itch into a great big rash.

The Biosafety Protocol: Hope for a GM-free world at last?

On 24th - 28th January, 134 countries met in Montreal, Canada, to establish

a system of international regulation for the safe handling, transfer and use of GMOs over national boundaries. With the failure of the W TO talks in Seattle last November, there was much anticipation that despite opposition from the 6 major GM-exporting nations known as 'the Miami Group', a strong Biosafety Protocol could be established to ensure that environmental and health concerns could take precedence over free trade.

Around 1000 protestors braved temperatures of -20 to show support for a strong Protocol. There was chanting and a 23 foot genetically altered com cob eating butterflies and a banner reading 'Stop genetic pollution. Biosafety Now!' Les Entartistes (Pie-Oneers) of Montreal had a veritable banquet with both the pro-GM Canadian Health Minister and biotech industry's top lobbyist in Canada, who is also the president of the World Chalition of the Biotechnology Industry cetting their just desserts!

Gene Dictators the World is Watching In solidarity with our Canadian friends, demonstrations took place outside Canada House in Traf Square, London. Banners bearing the slogan 'Gene dictators - the world is watching' were dropped from the roof, as the entrance was symbolically sealed with biohazard tape by protesters in decontamination suits. A huge caricature of an evil Uncle Sam holding puppet figures of the other members of the Miami Group filled the doorway, and 'trans-genic' cows invaded the building. The protest focused on the Miami Group (the US, Canada, Australia, Chile, Argentina and Uruguay) who were blocking progress in the talks. Later in the day, calling cards and letters were delivered to their respective embassies. Protests also took place in Australia and South Korea. [Remember: occupying an embassy is a 'criminal' rather than a 'civil' offence and diplomatic police and Embassy security guards carry guns. But also, whatever happens in an Embassy must be reported back to that country's government and usually makes it onto their media.]

Attempts at international regulation on GMOs The Biosafety Protocol, as part of the UN Convention on bio-diversity, was proposed to enshrine in international law two basic rights: a country's right to know what it is importing, and a government's right to say no to an import if it considers it unsafe for human consumption and the environment. The lack of such regulation on GE until now has made tracking imports of GM seeds, food, feed and fibres across international boundaries a difficult task, and left those countries wishing to impose a ban at risk of punitive action in the WTO for creating a barrier to free trade. Agreement has been a long time coming. Talks last year in Cartegena, Colombia failed due to the machinations of the Miami Group. It has consistently been the Southern countries who have pushed for strict regulation, led by Africa's FAO representative, Dr Tewolde Egziabher.

Now we have a Biosafety Protocol, we've won, haven't we? The Protocol does have the 'Precautionary Principle' enshrined in its text, which states that we shouldn't unleash potentially dangerous technology on the world until there is adequate scientific proof that it is safe (rather than a lack of scientific proof that it isn't). This is a MAJOR victory as it can be invoked by a country to reject GMOs. On the other hand, the Miami group insisted that GM commodities should only be labelled as 'may contain GMOs'.

Whilst this technically does not force GM-exporting countries to segregate GM and non-GM commodities, pressure from non-GM farmers and consumers, is likely to ensure segregation. Also whilst a regime for corporate liability is supposed to be put in place within 4 years, it could well take much longer to actually put it in to practice. Furthermore, despite the agreement speaking of the Protocol and other international agreements being 'mutually supportive, this vagueness has leaves it open for those so inclined to interpret this as the Protocol cannot override the right to trade under WTO rules on the right to free trade. The Codex Alimentarius Commission that decides the international standards for food safety for the WTO, has already attempted to do this.

Lets hope that countries party to both agreements accept the Biosafety Protocol as the superior instrument for deciding a future based on ecological justice and reining in corporate power. It must be ratified by 50 countries by the Nairobi meeting of the Convention on Bio-diversity in May. Start lobbying Ministers now!

The 'anti-organic' backlash

"Tell me what company thou keepest, and I'll tell thee what thou art" The current industry tack to force GM foods down our throats is to attack organic farming claiming that there is a high risk from E coli poisoning, that it will never feed the world because of low yields and that 'in conventional farming the total amount of pesticide residues that a person will consume in a year is equivalent in toxicity to one cup of coffee'. Hmm, what about Lindane and Organophosphates. For facts and figures that blow apart these myths, see the Soil Association website. More interesting is to explore where this patent nonsense is coming from:

Julian Morris, Roger Bate, Prof Philip Stott and Richard North (also seen struting his stuff on the Equinox Programme) were all contributors on the BBC Horizons rant against organics and are all associated with the right-wing pro-free trade, pro-Corporate think tank, the Institute of Economic Affairs. The Institute is vague about its funding sources, though, founded in the 1950s by a leading light in the broiler chicken industry, it has good reason to have the interests of industrial agriculture close to its heart.

The Grandaddy of them all is Dennis E coli is eight times more likely in organic food Avery, Director of the Global Centre for Food Issues at the Hudson Institute and well-known author of 'Saving the W orld with Pesticides and Plastics'. The Hudson Institute is funded by all the big names in the biotech industry including Monsanto, Aventis and AstraZeneca. "Operation: Avery's Savory" delivered Dennis his well-deserved pie last year, but we say MORE!

Pro-Vitamin A rice? The real and preventable problem of Vitamin A deficiency will not be solved by the Developed World's typical magic bullet approach. What is needed is a holistic approach to nutrition such as the UN and FAO 10-year programme to educate people about their diet and how to grow their own nutritious vegetables. It is, after all, industrial agriculture in the South that is denying people a proper diet as fields that used to be full of nutritious edible 'weeds', small fish and frogs have now all been killed of f by heavy duty herbicides. Higher yields= poorer diets.

Farming is currently facing a major crisis caused by over production and a succession of food scares (all related to intensive farming). The ray of hope in this bleak landscape is organic farming, based on a production system avoiding the use of artificial fertilisers and pesticides and based on crop rotations, sound husbandry and good management to promote health in crops and livestock. Organic farming has the support of the overwhelming majority of the British public and was mentioned a mere three times in the Prime Minister's address to the NFU AGM!!!

Non-violent activism means actively resisting violence through the conversion, dismantling and disarming of destructive weapons, machines, technologies and sources of pollution. Corporate violence, with its philosophy of profit before people and planet is increasingly being challenged in the UK and its seems that Blair can't bear the thought of the corporations moving to more established dictatorships for the sake of a law that could protect Corporate interests.
